Message from John Riberdy, Principal of ACCMS



Early last year I was thrilled to learn that I was being appointed to the position of principal for the new Assumption College Catholic Middle School. The challenge of opening a new school while launching the International Baccalaureate Programme with our grade 7 & 8 students was an exciting prospect.

While I had never attended Assumption as a student, years ago I was a caretaker at the school. Back then I was working as a caretaker while I attended the University of Windsor. Mr. Mulvey was the school's principal and I can still remember Lil Dumouchelle '75 teaching math in a classroom downstairs. I must admit that the first time I entered Assumption Catholic High School last year it was quite a shock for me. opened the doors off the main parking lot expecting to see a cafeteria, but instead found myself in a hallway which led

to the music room. While it did take me a few days to adjust to the change in the layout of the building, there was no doubt in my mind that what hadn't changed was the indomitable Raider Spirit. Both the staff students at Assumption gave our new school a warm welcome!

The new Middle School is located mainly on the ground floor of the Basilian wing, which is on the North side of the building as many of you are aware. It's a section of the school that I had never dared to venture into as a caretaker. It was limits to most Assumption staff in those days and I was too intimidated by the priests to even attempt to assuage my curiosity about what that part of the building looked like. Keeping that mind I find extremely ironic that I'm sitting in Bishop's former office while I write this article. How things change with time! (I kept the deep red plush wallpaper on one wall of the office as a reminder of those times).

While the former ground floor of the Basilian wing has been c o n v e r t e d i n t o classrooms, there's still more work to be done.

This summer a gym and student lounge will be constructed for the middle school (we've been sharing the high school's gym) which will cause some disruption to the roadway on the North side of the building. However, things should be back to normal relatively quickly. Please keep in mind that even though some structural changes have taken place, both the Chapel Sacristy been have preserved and will continue to be used in Eucharistic Celebrations as originally intended.

Assumption College Catholic Middle School is an International Baccalaureate Candidate school, focusing on the Middle Years Programme This will allow (MYP). students to enter the IB programme in grade 7. building a foundation for those students who wish to continue on with the IB Diploma Programme in high school. As such, the middle school supports and compliments programming at the secondary level.

Both the staff and students of the middle school are delighted to be a part of an institution with such a long and distinguished history as Assumption, and we look forward to being a part of its future as well!










Windsor student takes the stage in national poetry competition



David White admits he likes the spotlight, and he'll get his way this week.

The 17-year-old is among only 24 finalists out of 10,000 competitors from across the country headed to Vancouver for a national poetry recitation contest.

"I've always loved being in front of an audience and talking, it's kind of my thing," White, a student at Assumption College School, said. "I like being the centre of attention."

White will took the stage on April 20th the English language division of the Poetry in Voice competition in Vancouver.

Poetry in Voice is a charitable organization that encourages

Canadian students to appreciate poetry through reading, writing and recitation. Literary greats Dionne Brand, Anne Michaels and Margaret Atwood are among its supporters.

The finalists will compete for a total of \$25,000 in prizes for themselves and their school libraries.

Last year, White's friend Enzo Campa won the national competition, which was held in Toronto.

Competitors were required to choose two poems from a selected list, then memorize and recite them in front of an audience. White won his school competition, which gave him the opportunity to record himself reciting three poems and submit them to the Poetry in Voice website.

White later learned he was one of 12 English-speaking competitors from across Canada chosen to compete at the national event in Vancouver. There are also French and bilingual categories, each with six finalists.

The poems White chose to recite are A Supermarket in California by his favourite poet Allen Ginsberg, Sometimes a Voice by Canadian poet Don McKay and Alone by Edgar Allan Poe.

"The ones that I chose were all sort of narrative," said White. "They tell a story but it's in an absurd, surreal way. They're all just interesting and quirky, and they just stood out to me among all the rest."

White, who will recite the same poems in Vancouver, was surprised to learn he beat out 10,000 other people.

"It's definitely achievement, even if I don't end up winning or even making the top six," said White. "Even making it to Vancouver is pretty cool. It's kind of a surreal experience because last year I didn't even win the school competition and now I'm going to the nationals. I'm excited. And I get to go to Vancouver all expenses paid."

Our Lady of Assumption Parish Celebrating 250th Anniversary



The Assumption Parish dates back to Oct. 3, 1767 when its first pastor was named and assigned to care for Huron and French settlers on what is now Windsor's west end near the shores of the Detroit River. That has Assumption's parishioners this year poised to celebrate the 250th anniversary with several activities planned in the months ahead.

"Assumption (parish) is something that has always been in the hearts and minds of people in this community," said Kevin Alexander, chairman of the parish council. "Historically, it's part of the first people who came here."

"Things change over time, but constantly for 250 years we have had this spiritual presence in place in the community," he added. The first

church under Assumption parish was made of timbers and opened in 1787 on the eastern edge of parish property between University Avenue and Riverside Drive — today a park just east of the Ambassador Bridge.

The original wooden structure was replaced by the showpiece larger Assumption Church building that opened on University Avenue near the intersection of Huron Church Road in July 1845. Due to disrepair, the aging landmark was shuttered in November 2014 for regular mass and its fate has remained in limbo.

Assumption Church is a nationally protected historic site. But the masonry, exterior support walls, roof, plaster, a storm drainage system, and the mechanical and electrical systems all need to be repaired or replaced. The parish pastor, Rev. Maurice Restivo, remains hopeful the church can somehow generate funds and be repaired. "There is no capital campaign right now, (but) if we were ever to get a major donor the diocese would reopen a campaign and we would hopefully be able to restore the church and return," he said in an email. "We hope that by being in the public eye for our 250th, someone might come forward."

The parish has relocated about a dozen blocks away to Holy Name of Mary Church on McEwan Avenue which was opened in 1917 when Assumption's congregation grew too large. The parish's 250th anniversary celebrations started with a potluck celebration held a few weeks ago to recognize the former St. Patrick's parish. Next up are similar dinner celebrations on June 18 for the former Blessed Sacrament Parish and Holy Name of Mary Parish on Sept 12.

Assumption Church will re-open for a couple of days this summer for the annual Feast Day celebration and community barbecue on Aug. 13 and again on Aug. 15 for tours and prayers. Several other activities are also being planned by the parish's anniversary committee for the months ahead, but not yet been finalized, Alexander said.

On Sunday, Oct. 1, Holy Name Of Mary will host the primary celebration for the actual Oct. 3 founding anniversary. Mass will occur at 11 a.m. with Bishop Ronald Fabbro and Bishop Joseph Dabrowski in attendance followed by a gala luncheon.


